- Spring work duties have been or are in process of being completed thanks to all who signed up and helped
 - Tim Sprague completed yearly maintenance on our mowers
- The Barn will be open June 8 with rain date of June 22. We are also looking for and correcting cause of dirt coming from upper floor of barn to cover the lower left section of the barn causing a lot of extra work cleaning it up.
- Looking into sealcoating the upper lot in order to keep it longer. We have reached out to companies and are waiting for the last bid to come in.
- Lisa Ostrowski has put together a "Garden Commission" to revitalize the beds in front of and on the side of the Parish house. Thanks to all who have helped and those who continue to work on this project.

Sunday School / Christian Ed.

- On April 28th we went to Fenton -Ruby Park in Willington for a hike, we had eight children and twelve adults. Thanks to Michele for suggesting this location
- Linda found a baby monitor in the barn and tested it to be used to broadcast the service from the sanctuary to the nursery so if someone is manning the nursery they will be able to follow along with the service.
- Childrens Day will be Sunday June 23rd. There will be a presentation of goodie bags and the two older students will be presented with Bibles. After the service there will be outdoor games and potluck meal. Everyone is invited to participate.
 - The monies collected from the children through out the year will be used to re-stock the class rooms. These are some of the items discussed at our council meeting.

Our Spring workday has concluded as all duties have been signed up for. As you complete these roles please check off that they were finished. Thank you to everyone who signed up. We will do another one in the Fall.

Tim Sprague did our yearly maintenance on our mowers including sharpening the blades, oil changes, and changing out the spark plugs/air filters that needed to be changed. Thanks Tim!

We reached out to four companies about sealcoating and paving our upper parking lot. Due to budgets and estimated cost we have decided to hold off on this for now.

Lastly, Lisa put together a Garden Commission after signing up to weed the garden beds. We have dug out all the primrose, and thinned out the Iris and Lilies. We dug out the Yuca and due to a bittersweet infestation we had to remove the spirea. We fertilized and are keeping the two rhododendrons and have put edging and 3 inches of mulch in all finished areas. We are bagging all invasive vines and taking them off the property. We kept the butterfly bush and added two wigelia bushes in place of what had to be dug out. Everything is easy to maintain and are great pollinators. We sadly have to cut down the lilacs and remove all the bittersweet as that is where the problem is coming from. We hope to have that clear and resolved in the coming weeks. With a little persistence each year these gardens should stay maintained and beautiful. All edging and new plants were donated by Lisa, and all mulch was donated by Andrew. Thanks Lisa for your donations and putting this much needed project together. This project did not cost the church any money, and has been volunteer run.


