TREASURER'S REPORT

Thru April 30

CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council met on Tuesday evening April 17th at 6:30 and discussed numerous items; the following are some of interest:

- <u>**Pastor Bob**</u> reports that in addition to preparing worship, sermons, educational programs for the adults and meeting with individuals he continues to use social media to get the word out about our church.
- He also expresses hope that there may be a way to get adolescents connected in our church and participate in some kind of youth ministry.
- He was pleased that during the Lenten season the opportunities of both online and in person services were well received and attended.
- <u>**Treasurer**</u> reports that all bills have been paid and commitments met. He was going to move some money from invested funds to the checkbook.
- <u>Church Clerk</u> reports that church membership on Jan. 1, 2024 was 64; we have since that time lost three members. One by transfer and two (George McGinness and Dan Irish) by death. Our current membership stands at 61.
- **<u>Diaconate</u>** Easter flowers were delivered to our shut-ins.
- We have a new Deacon! Thank you Teresa Raymond for joining diaconate.
- We purchased gluten and allergen free wafers for communion if you need them.
- We received a lot of flower donations from the congregation for Easter. Green carnations were donated by Michelle's Floral and Garden Dream is again donating flats to be used at our Earth Day event.
- <u>**Trustees**</u> Sign up sheet for Spring work day available in kitchen, sign up for a job and complete it at your convenience marking it done after completion.
- We have a new company for the fire extinguishers as our current provider is retiring after 54 years of service.
- Tom Hoefle will cut up a tree that fell and will replace our leaking kitchen faucets. Thank you Tom.
- The annual Safe Conduct Policy training will be done after service on Sunday April 21 in the Library. This class is for Nursery volunteers, teachers, aides and Safe Conduct Committee.
- <u>Sunday School / CE</u> We now have 14 students in Sunday School and have added 3 teacher aides to help out.
- Our Nursery is open and available for anyone who wants to use it.
- On April 28 after the service, we will carpool to Fenton-Ruby Park in Willington for a hike.
- We are looking at June 23 to possibly be Childrens Day; we still have some things to iron out but we will have a date set by the next council meeting and maybe have lunch after.

MAY FLEA MARKET
